Key facts

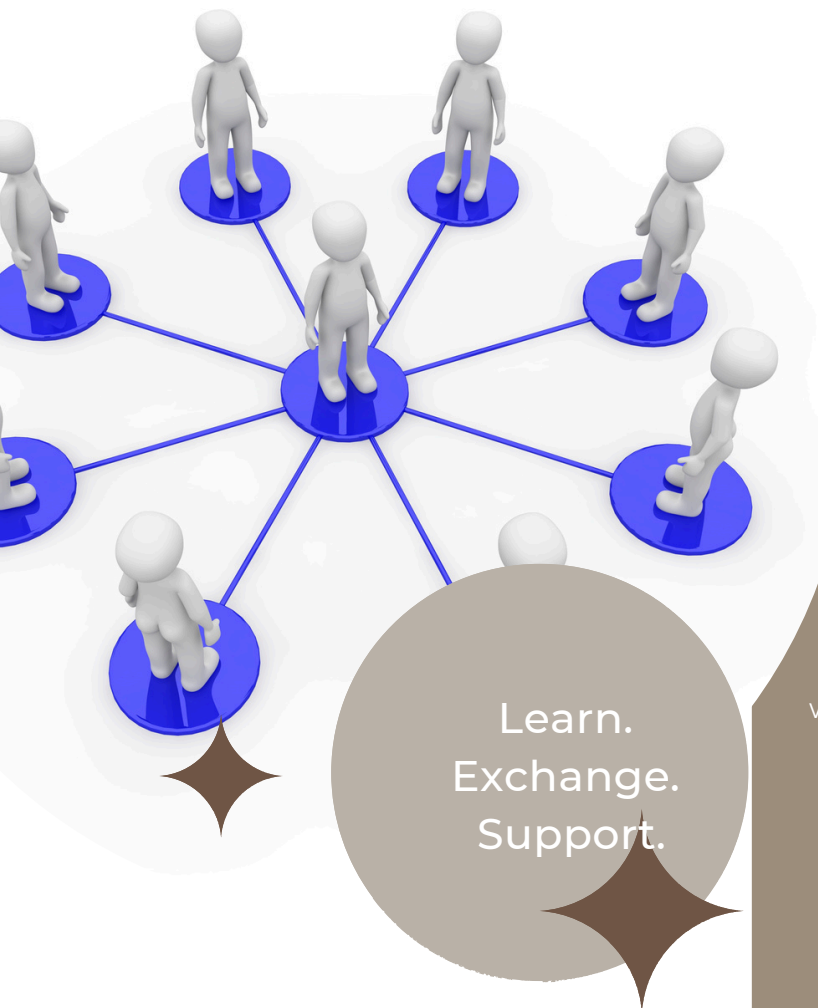
~1 800 unaccompanied minors per month sought asylum in the EU in mid-2025.

~35 000 unaccompanied minors applied for asylum in 2024 — about 15 % of all minor applicants.

Why Embrace UAM?

While asylum systems are essential, the quality of daily support depends on professionals working in shelters, youth welfare, education, and social care. Many face:

1. limited access to trauma-informed training
2. few opportunities for international peer exchange
3. high emotional and organisational pressure
4. Embrace UAM addresses these gaps by strengthening professional skills, learning, and European cooperation.
